You'll learn to navigate correctional facilities, as well as mental health, educational, and child welfare agencies and services. Through theory, lab courses, and hands-on fieldwork, you'll develop the skills to facilitate positive change for children, adolescents, and their families. Please note: You are required to follow the shift work schedules and routines of your fieldwork placements, which could include nights and weekends.

- Accelerated program so you can earn a 3-year advanced diploma in 2 years (study 10 months per year)
- First Canadian program to receive national accreditation from the Child & Youth Care Educational Accreditation Board (CYCEAB)
